Lettmair Au Interpretive Trail



This interpretive trail was severely affected by wind during a storm in August 2022. The destruction caused won't be tidied up. In a national park, we allow nature to develop freely, even if that means leaving lots of criss-crossed fallen trees as they are.

Brief description: Walking trail on level terrain

Starting point: Weidendom Visitor Centre

Length: 1.3 kilometres (circular route)

Rest areas: Seating is available along the trail.

Leierweg Accessible Walking Trail



The Leierweg trail is all about accessibility. Many barriers exist, both in nature and in our own minds. Embark on an unforgettable nature experience. Visitors with mobility disabilities can rent a wheelchair with a pulling device (Swiss-Tracs).

Wheelchair with a pulling device: € 4 per hour, € 25 per day

Brief description: Accessible walking trail with a gentle incline

Starting point: Weidendom Visitor Centre Car Park

Length: 4.0 kilometers (circular route)

Rest areas: Seating is available along the trail.

Rest areas: Seating is available along the trail.

Johnsbachsteg & River Swimming Area



Enjoy stunning views of the Hochtorguppe mountain range from the wooden bridge over the River Enns. Just beside it is the only permitted swimming area at the visitor centre, where you can refresh yourself in the cool waters of the Enns.
